


For Sunday, August 23:

When there is a Worship Service at the Church, there will be basic "livestreaming" available for those at home.

Guidelines for Attending a Sunday Service

- 1. Do not come if you are sick with anything contagious (even a cold, etc), are required to self isolate or have been in contact with someone who has COVID-19.
- 2. We'd like to use the outside front entrance area for socializing after the service, so for those that can, please park away from the front entrance (by Campbell Street) or if you prefer, in the back parking lot. If you have mobility issues you can still park in the front handicap areas.
- 3. We will sign you in when you arrive. There is hand sanitizer available and also masks if you would like one.
- 4. There is also quick drying hand sanitizer by the bathroom for spraying bathroom faucets, doorknobs, handles, etc. after each use. Only use the bathrooms by the Office.
- 5. Maintain physical distancing of 6 feet (also stay apart when socializing outside).
- 6. There will be no congregational singing at this time though there will be worship music projected throughout the Service.
- 7. The Library is closed come during the week when the Office is open.
- 8. There is no Nursery though you can use the Fireside Room for childcare if needed (the Daycare side of the church is not available). There is a Toy Box for 10 am and a Toy Box for 11 am.
- 9. There is no Sunday School.
- 10. There is no coffee and socializing is in the front parking lot.
- 11. Sit apart from others in the Sanctuary (family groups can stay together).
- 12. We will celebrate Lord's Supper and you can pick up the wafer and juice package before you enter the Sanctuary.
- 13. Offerings can be dropped off in a box at the back of the Sanctuary as you enter or exit the Sanctuary.

Council Report - Monday, August 10, 2020

- The church's FULL Council met on Monday in the Fellowship Hall with adequate spacing and sanitizing. With Pastor Kevin we focused for a time on Psalm 51 where David shares his joy that in some, so far mysterious, way the Lord will provide salvation from sin. A salvation that was not available through sacrifices and burnt offerings.
- A basic method of live-streaming the Sunday worship service was tried on August 9. It is expected that this method will continue to be used (instead of pre-recorded music and sermon). Improvements of the basic method will be added as methods are investigated and as equipment becomes available.
- On August 16 there will not be an in-building worship service as Pastor Kevin is on vacation and other pulpit supply was/is not readily available.
- Council is looking into the possibility of having a "Freedom Session" Bible study program in the fall.
- Various worship/covid19 issues were again discussed and it was agreed to have only a 10 AM worship service on Sundays and ask persons from the designated two worship groups to do a "signup" if they expect to attend.

Services will be with less than 50 persons and have adequate social-distancing and sanitizing (no congregation singing). Other members are encouraged to watch the live-stream broadcast of the Sunday worship service.

Next meeting of the Full Council is scheduled for Sep. 14.
