

COUNCIL REPORT - Monday, June 14, 2021

- The church's FULL Council met in the church Fellowship Hall on Monday, with masks and social distancing.

Frank G welcomed members to our meeting, with a special welcome to newly installed and ordained members. New members signed a copy of the CRC's Covenant for Officebearers.

- For our devotions, Pastor Kevin read Isaiah 43:1, 18,19 and with us reflected on forgetting past difficulties or issues and expecting God to begin new things among us. We can still be grateful to God for his goodness of the past as we now press on to the goal that is set before us. He then opened the meeting with prayer.
- Council members discussed the possibility of adding a staff member who will give leadership to our ministry programs. In the future Council will continue exploring this position and present a proposal to the congregation.
- As council teams get organized, they will be involved with developing handbooks for their focus on council:

Worship ministry Pastoral ministry Youth & Family ministry Missional ministry Stewardship Ministry

- Deacons reviewed with us the scheduled order of collections for the coming months.
- As part of our responsibilities, Council oversees the resignation and the welcoming of new members into our fellowship. It was with sadness and regret that council discussed and agreed to accept the resignation of one of our members.
- Worship Committee submitted a detailed report on possible future arrangements and you can read more about those in the weekly bulletins with those arrangements being in flux as the Covid19 pandemic decreases.

Next meeting of the Full Council is scheduled for July 12.

Letter to the Congregation from the Chair of Council

June 18, 2021 Dear Friends in Christ,

Praise be to God for the great news from Dr. Bonnie Henry regarding in-person worship! In her telephone town hall meeting with faith leaders she stated that as of July 1, all restrictions for inperson worship services will be removed if we continue with low number of cases and increased vaccinations. This means we would be able to worship again in person — everyone at the same time. We would also be allowed to praise God with our voices and sing His praises. No masks would be required. Basically, everything would return to pre-pandemic mode. All activities and programs could also restart with the new season. We would be able to have coffee socials again after the service as well as the church picnic this summer. Having said that, we will wait for the official decision in the next couple of weeks. Let us all follow Dr. Henry's mantra, 'be kind, be calm, be safe'.

Now that we are hoping we can return to pre-pandemic worship, on behalf of council and the congregation, I would like to again express a huge heartfelt thank you to Michelle N, Matt B, and Sheri A for making our remote worship more meaningful. THANK YOU! Also, a thank you to Angelina W for adding to the worship by providing scripture reading and prayer. Another huge thank you to Joel D for faithfully working the sound system and live streaming service. THANK YOU Joel! We also want to thank pastor Kevin. It hasn't been easy preaching to a camera Sunday after Sunday. Thank you for your persistence in bring God's Word to us.

Council met on Monday and it was a great experience to see everyone in person. A warm welcome was extended to the newly installed office bearers. We pray that in their work, they may be a blessing to our church family and also that they may be blessed as well as they work within their ministries. We are still in need for a couple of deacons and will be asking for nominations in the next month or two. We hope and pray that a few nominations may be forthcoming. From my experience, it is an honour and privilege to serve God and His church family here in Duncan. It is my hope that others may also experience that as well.

We also ask for your continued prayers for those who are dealing with medical issues. Even though some may be dealing with more serious medical concerns than others, it is important that we bring everyone's needs before God. We pray that God will work through the doctors and nurses as they care for those in need. Also pray for those who are in care homes and are unable to meet with us in person. They also need to experience the love of God as they deal with their concerns. We also pray for our older members who may have mobility issues and who have difficulty getting around. We also ask you to pray for the new ministry program as it begins this summer. We pray that through this restructured program everyone in the congregation will be served – from toddler to senior. We can certainly look upward to heaven and declare, "Great is Thy faithfulness".

Family Sunday Guidelines

Family Sunday - Week 4 of every month

Duncan CRC is excited to announce the incorporation of Family Sunday on June 27th and recurring on the 4th Sunday of every month. This special service will include a Children's Worship time which will take place for the entire service. At this time there is allowance for groups of 50 in two different locations, so the children will worship in one area, parents in the other. Children's worship will be available for ages 3 - 11 and will include worship time, devotions, crafting, outside play and a snack. Worship time will be led by our Sunday School team. Families will be gifted with a story bible upon their return to worship with us! Children are to be dropped off and picked up at the back of the building.

To maintain proper COVID protocols, children will not be released to any other part of the building and families are not to re-enter the church after pick up. All parents must wear a mask at drop off and pick up.

Children's Worship COVID Plan: Guidelines followed as outlined in BC Centre for Disease Control's COVID-19 Public Health Guidance for Child Care Settings.

Entrance/Exit Size Limit and Spacing: No more than 50, including adults. If the group is over 20, the option is in place for centres to take place at different times so children can occupy different areas at different times

Health Checks and Contact Tracing: Signage will be posted and referenced.

Families will be met at the back door by Sunday School staff in order to check in and assure that a health check is completed by parents. Parents do not enter the building at this point, they enter at the front of the building.

Contact information for families will be received by Sunday School staff at the door upon sign in.

Drop Off/Pick Up: Will take place at the back entry.

Parents will sign in and sign out children ONLY at this entry. Children will NOT be dismissed to any other part of the building

Masks: Signage will be posted. All persons 12 and over will wear a mask.

Sanitization: All participants will sanitize upon entering and exiting the building and when needed. Sanitizer will be available for use in multiple locations.

Snacks: Prepacked, pre-portioned snack will be available to children.

Children will be given their own water bottles which will be labelled with their name.

Supplies:

When possible, children will have individual supplies (such as playdough). When this is not possible, sanitizer will be made available.

Restroom Facilities

Will be shared, then sanitized by an adult after use.
