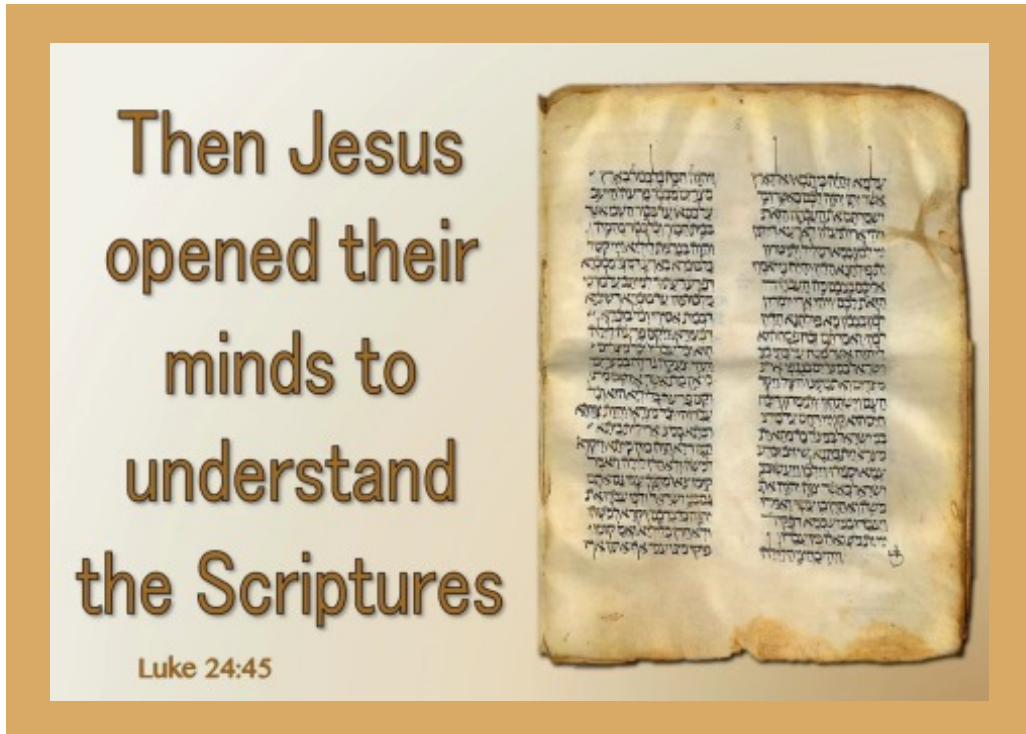

What does it look like, sound like, and feel like to communicate well?

How does it feel to be heard, valued, and respected while wrestling with things that might challenge us? As our denomination prepares for weighty discussions concerning the Bible's teaching on human sexuality and sexual ethics in the church we, as a congregation desire to join in discussions as well. Although the content of these meetings could be tenuous, we hope to use this time to engage in positive communication practices. Ephesians 4:3 reads, "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." This means valuing each other though we may be at different places in our Christian journey. As a congregation, we should strive towards creating a space that is safe in which to be vulnerable, inviting different perspectives rather than acting in judgment due to fear. Being uncomfortable is okay, it is good to truly consider who Christ wants us to be as individuals and as a congregation.
